The role

Northeastern University London wishes to appoint a NULab Coordinator for Texts, Maps and Networks.

The NULab for Texts, Maps and Networks is the home for research and teaching across Digital Humanities and Computational Social Science at Northeastern. Based primarily in the College of Social Science and Humanities (CSSH) in Boston, the NULab has collaborated in multiple ways with faculty in London since 2019. In the context of the London campus's rapid expansion and growing emphasis on research aligned with the NULab's core principles, NU London wishes to appoint a local faculty member to serve as a primary point of contact between both parties.

The NULab Coordinator will help put in place structures that help coordinate, regularise and grow NULab's growing footprint beyond Boston. The post's responsibilities will include:

- Promoting and sharing work among the NULab's communities in London, Boston, and Oakland
- Maintaining a list of NULab London members and recruiting new membership
- Serving as a central point of contact for the dissemination of information between London faculty and the larger NULab network
- Supporting and growing collaborations between campuses in the NULab network, including Boston and Oakland
- Facilitating 'home grown' NULab activities in London (workshops, symposia etc) and connecting these to other parts of the NULab network (e.g. through sessions at the NULab Spring conference and other hybrid events.)
- Growing research collaborations with the Digital Integration Teaching Initiative where appropriate (e.g. promoting opportunities in London, connecting research and curriculum initiatives)
- Helping London colleagues understand NULab infrastructures for grant-writing

About the University

Founded in 2012, Northeastern University London (formerly known as New College of the Humanities) has established itself as a prestigious higher education institution based in the heart of London. Northeastern University London is part of Northeastern University's Global Campus Network. Positioned as top ranking in the USA, Northeastern has campuses in Arlington, Boston, Charlotte, Miami, Oakland, San Jose, and Seattle in the USA, and Toronto and Vancouver in Canada.
